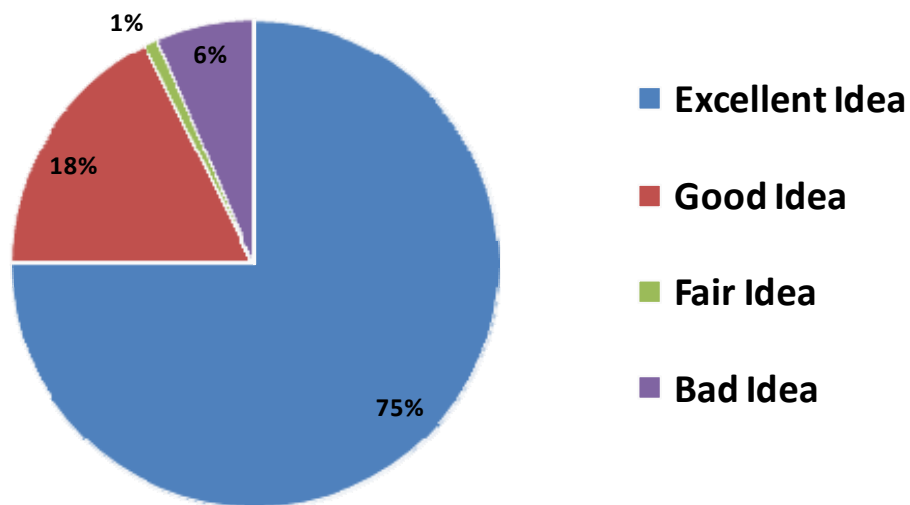




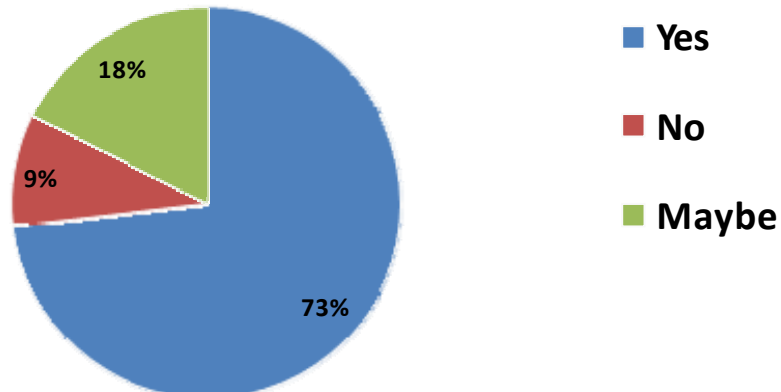
Brush! Recycling Survey Results

Total Responses: 108

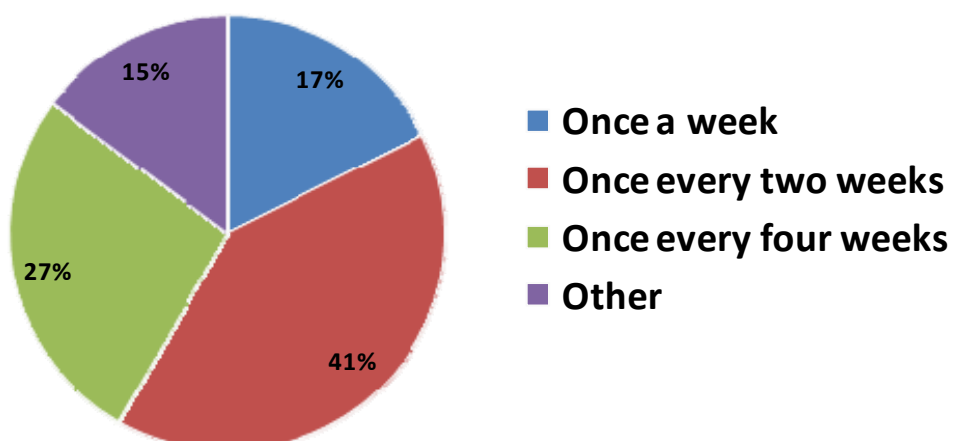
1. I think Recycling is a/an: (choose one)



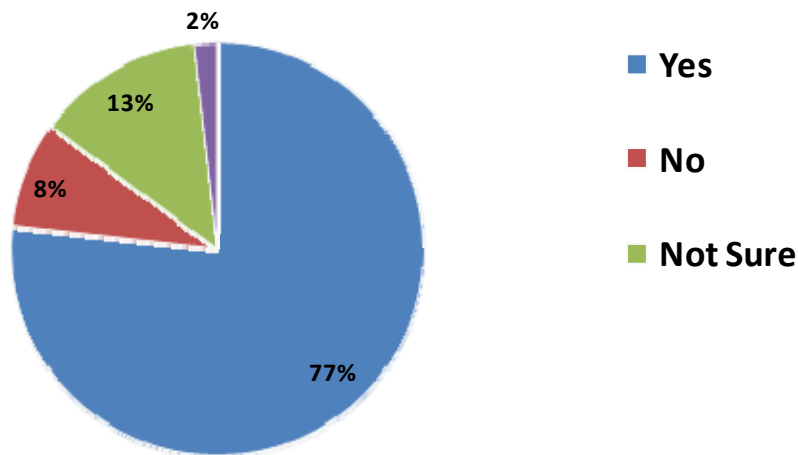
2. Do you think curbside recycling should be available in the City of Brush!? (choose one)



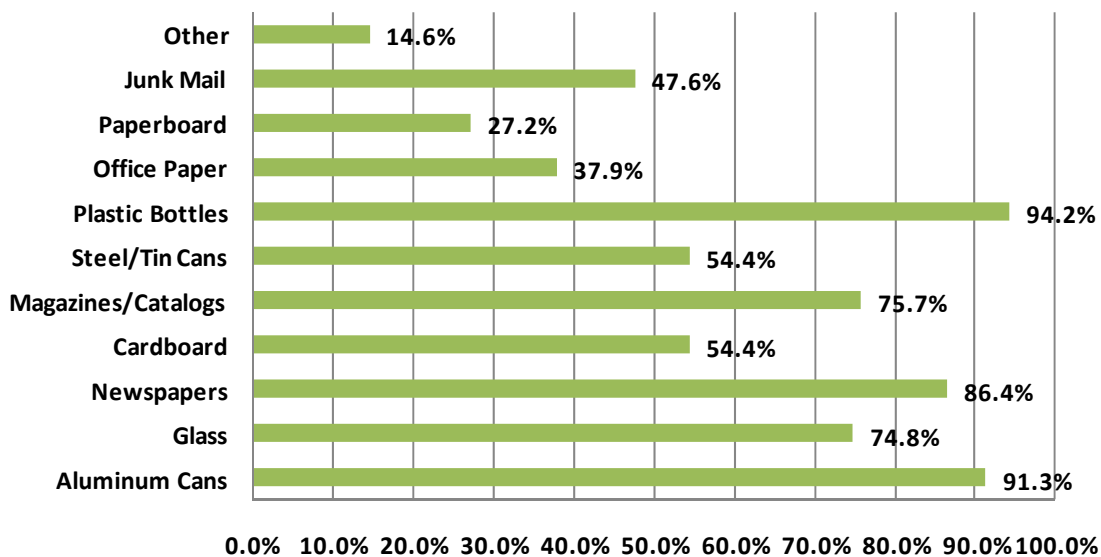
3. If the City had curbside recycling, how often should it be picked up? (choose one)

Comments

- Have three cans: Yard Waste/Trash/Recyclables. Create jobs for a sorting warehouse of recyclables.
